It is a country where you can do whatever you want and come from any background9 and you will be accepted. My best friends in school were one boy from Nepal, one boy from Thailand, and one

boy from Malaysia. Australia really is a fantastic place and you should all visit!

Canberra is the capital city of Australia. About 367,000 people live there. It is not a part of any state.



The flag uses three symbols: the Union Jack Flag (symbolizes Australia's relationship to Britain), the Commonwealth Star (seven points are the states/territories) and the Southern Cross, a star constellation (=souhvězdí), which represented Australia when it was a British colony.



Sydney has the largest population in Australia – more than four million people. Its most famous building is the Sydney Opera House. It was designed by Danish architect Jorn Utzon. Queen Elizabeth II formally opened it in 1973.




#### **Aboriginal art**
